To submit your application, you must provide us with:

- this application form, completed and signed
- a copy of your ID document
- a copy of a bank statement showing your name and IBAN (tip: ink out the bank balance)

Please note: We can only consider your application if you provide us with these three documents.

Sending or visiting

You can send your damaged euro banknotes to us by post or schedule an appointment to visit our exchange counter.



Sending

Send us this application form by post and be sure to include a copy of your ID document and of a bank statement. We recommend that you make the citizen service number (BSN) unreadable, including in the numbers at the bottom. You can choose to include your damaged euro banknotes or await our decision. Once we have informed you that we will consider your application, you can send us the banknotes. Pack the banknotes in a see-through bag.

Please note: You may send a maximum of €2,000 by post. If the value of your banknotes is higher, we ask that you contact us to schedule an appointment at our exchange counter in Amsterdam.



Visiting

To schedule an appointment, first send us this application form by post and be sure to include a copy of your ID document and of a bank statement. We will send you confirmation after we have received your application, informing you how to schedule an appointment to visit our exchange counter in Amsterdam.

If the amount does not exceed €450, you can contact us immediately to schedule an appointment. Tel.: +31 20 524 27 27 on Monday to Friday between 9:00 – 12:00.

When you visit our exchange counter in Amsterdam, be sure to bring your damaged euro banknotes, this application form, your ID document and a bank statement.
